




ELDER DEJAGER RETURNS TO OKC

While teaching the inhabitants of the Americas following his death and resurrection, the Savior asked, "...What manner of men ought ye to be? Verily I say unto you, even as I am." Then he went on to indicate how they were to achieve it. "And now I go unto the Father. And verily I say unto you, what-soever things ye shall ask the Father in my name shall be given unto you. Therefore, ask, and ye shall receive; knock, and it shall be opened unto you; for he that asketh, receiveth; and unto him that knocketh, it shall be opened." (3NEPHI 27:28-29)

There can be little doubt that prayer is to be one of the primary means by which we are to interact with our Heavenly Father. However, the Lord indicated to Jeseph Smith that he expects us to do more than to simply ask. "And Satan is abroad in the land, and he goeth forth deceiving the nations - wherefore he that prayeth, whose spirit is contrite, the same is accepted of me if he obey mine ordanances..." (D&C 52:14-15)

Certainly the clearest statement of the level of involvement the Lord wants us to have is found in D&C 9:7-9, where we are implored to ask, but only after we have studied matters out in our own minds and determined on the basis of our judgement and experience, the course of action we should take. Then, as we are given bery specific keys by which we can confirm through the spirit whether or not our answer or proposed action is correct.

Some may question the process, thinking, "Why should I go to all that trouble when it would be so much simpler to merely ask?" We must remember that a part of our purpose in this life is to show our Father in Heaven, through our actions, that we will use our free agency to make wise choices and accept the consequences of our actions. Does it seem reasonable that we can accomplish this if we take no thought, save it be to ask?

What a great blessing it is to know that our Heavenly Father has enough confidence in us to let us search out for ourselves the answers to our questions and problems. And... at the same time, he loves us enough that once we have done our part, we can go corward with complete confidence that our solution is correct.

It makes sense then that we must follow a similar course of growth and development as the Savior. "And he received not of the fullness at first, but continued from grace to grace, until he received a fullness;..." (D&C 93:13). And as we perfect our ability to make correct choices, we can untimately accom-

plish what we were placed here to achieve...namely to return to his presence. "Verily, thus sayeth the Lord; it shall come to pass that every soul who for-saketh his sins and cometh unto me, and calleth on my name, and obeyeth my voice, and keepeth my commandments, shall see my face and know that I am." (DEC 93:1)

This generation, and, in particular, we Latter-Day Saints, are the most blessed of all the souls who have inhabited this earth! In our time, the creator of all things has revealed himself anew to prophets of this modern age and within the framework of a mere 150 years has extinguished the gross darkness which had enveloped the world for centuries! Once again the word of the living God hisses forth from the mouths and inspired writings of his chosen servents. How fortunate we are to be able to possess copies of these inspired texts: the Holy Bible, The Book of Mormon, Doctrine and Covenants, and the Pearl of Great Price! What knowledge is in our grasp! The answers to life's greatest questions!

Yet, how many of us in our present status are capable of explaining: The difference between a translated being and a transfigured being; or the keys to detecting a false spirit; or why baptisms for the dead are performed below the surface of the earth; or what language the Jêredites spoke?? Some of these questions may seem merely trivial, but who has earnestly read and pondered the scriptures seriously without gaining insight in all

facets of the gospel?

President Joseph Fielding Smith once said: "From time to time members of the Church are deceived and led astray because they have no substantial foundation in faith, and lack knowledge of the Gospel. Skillful deceivers, under these conditions, prey upon the weak and destroy the little measure of faith which they possess. Therefore, it behooves us all to be alert, diligent and studious, doing all things in prayer and humility. Then

we can overcome the world...

"If members of the Church would search their scriptures more intensely in the spirit of humility and prayer disputations would cease among us. It seems to be a difficult thing to eliminate from the minds of some of our brethren cherished notions that are contrary to the revealed word. Many questions have been answered time and time again by those who have the knowledge and are prepared to give the answers, yet the error continues to exist... The reason for these answers to questions is to endeavor to settle once and for all time the problems discussed, which occur and reoccur so frequently, yet are answered in the standard works; moreover, with the thought in mind to stimulate members of the Church to spend a little more of their spare time in personal search. Of far more profit is a fact discovered by research than by information received. The impression on the mind lasts longer."

As President Smith pointed out, all too often it is that "trivial" piece of information that is "not important to our salvation" that forms a stumbling block for those who have "no substantial foundation in faith." Under such circumstances it very well may be important to that individual's salvation! Granted, some gospel subjects are more imperative than others; yet if trivia will stimulate a genuine interest in scripture study it is answering a real need.

One does not study the scriptures by briefly scanning a few passages. As President Smith pointed out, "The trouble with so many of us is the fact that we reach conclusions in relation to some matters without knowing all the facts pertaining to the specific events. It is very apparent that a large proportion of the members of

the Church do not prepare themselves thoroughly by study prayer and faith to understand many of the revelations which have been placed before us. This lack of comprehension is not the fault of the Lord, but the fault of the individual.

"Perhaps I may be pardoned for this thought which I present without any desire to find fault, but merely to impress upon our minds the need of a more thorough search of the revealed word of the Lord in sincere prayer and humility of spirit. It is a simple matter to reach incorrect conclusions when only a part of the facts are understood. Therefore, the members of the Church, and especially those holding the devine Priesthood, should be diligent in their study with the spirit of humility and prayer."

Within the full-time missionaries' "UNIFIED SYSTEM FOR TEACHING FAMILIES" manual is a missionary study guide which may be adapted with great success to the

individual or family:

How To Study

- 1. SEEK THE SPIRIT. There is no possible way to understand the gospel, the scriptures, the things of God, except by the power of the Holy Chost.
- SEARCH THE SCRIPTURES. Search in an orderly, systematic way. For instance, read the Book of Mormon at least five times.
- 3. PONDER UPON THE SCRIPTURES. Meditate and think about the doctrines of the Gospel continually. In reading the Book of Mormon, for instance, ask yourself over and over again, in faith and prayer: "Could any man have written this book?"
- Make a list of all the basic doctrines fo the gospel and study what all the standard works have to say about each of them, analyzing, comparing, harmonizing.
- 5. LEARN TO OUTLINE. Always outline a subject.
 Joseph Smith's outline of
 the subject of faith, for
 instance, contained the following general heads, with
 numerous subheads under each:
 - (A) What it is.(B) The object upon which it rests.
 - (C) The effects which flow from it.
- 6. MEMORIZE IMPORTANT SCRIPTURES. Begin with those which establish the message of the restoration and teach distinctive doctrines of the Gospel, and then go to those of general doctrinal and literary excellence.

STUDY EVERY DAY.

This includes a one hour study class, plus additional personal study. During these, missionaries should:

- (A) Recite memorized passages of scripture.
- (B) Read to each other out of the Standard Works.
- (C) Discuss the doctrines thus read.
- (D) Prepare outlines of Gospel Doctrines.

Following this study plan in the missionary manual was a list of one hundred sixty - two basic doctrines suggested for studying and outlining (SEE #4 ABOVE.) It is our priviledge and duty to study and gain a working knowledge of the scriptures. Don't let these figures overwhelm you! Remember, even Christ, in his mortal state, learned line upon line, precept upon precept, continuing from grace to grace until he gained a fullness of the Gospel. The world has so long wallowed in darkness that we have nearly forgotten how to see... today the Earth is flooded with divine light: WE NEED ONLY OPEN OUR EYES.

Sunday, 28 February 1982, the members of the Oklahoma City Fourth Ward were blessed by having two members of the Elder's Quorum Presidency speak during Sacrement Meeting. The main topic stressed was the institution of a daily scripture reading program and a series of checks to monitor the Individual member's progress. If at least two pages of scriptures are read a day, the four standard works will have been read in approximately forty-three months.

A survey was taken throughout the Ward with the following results: 40 percent read at least once a week, and 60 percent have no regularly scheduled reading program. Of those 60 percent, 40 percent have not begun any kind of program/

I GOT A PHONE CALL...FROM DAD!! THE LORD, KNOWING MY SITUATION, IMPRESSED DAD TO CALL ME FIRST, SO THAT WE COULD DISCUSS THAT PROBLEM, AND THAT PROBLEM EXCLU-SIVELY. DAD'S WORDS WERE: "WE WERE STRONGLY IMPRES-SED TO CALL HOME."

SO WE CAN BEAR TESTIMONY THAT THE LORD WATCHES OUT FOR US ALL, AND EVEN OUR LITTLE PROBLEMS ARE WORTH HIS TIME AND CARING. HE LOVES US VERY MUCH.






ROAD SHOW

My PRAYER...

"Father, it is not forme to say who thy chosen are...

I read these words again and they suddenly take on new meaning. How could I be so faithless? Why did I give

up so easily?

Father, I have been so faithful in all else; I have done all that you have asked to the best of my ability; done it willingly, gladly, greatfully, lovingly. All that you have asked OF me FOR me. But I now realize that I have fallen short in a very big area of my life and my stewardship. I ask, my Father, thy forgiveness for this shortcoming, and ask thy help in remembering this and striving to improve my faithfulness.

Children will no longer be required to memorize the Articles of Faith before graduation. Instead, understanding and memorizing the Articles of Faith will be


a gradual process.


CONGRATULATIONS — YOUNG ADULTS —

AS I BECOME MORE SENSITIVE TO THIS, I BECOME A BETTER STUDENT AND I LEARN MORE.

IT'S AMAZING WHEN AN ELDER OR SISTER BEARS A SIMPLE TESTIMONY OR SAYS A SIMPLE PRAYER TO OUR FATHER. THE HOLY GHOST IS SO STRONG THAT IT TOUCHES THE HEART IN SUCH A WAY THAT IT BRINGS TEARS TO THE EYES AND HUMILITY TO THE HEART. WHEN BROTHERS AND SISTERS ARE SET APART AS MISSIONARIES, THEY ARE GIVEN A GREAT POWER WHICH I CANNOT COMPREHEND COMPLETELY.
