

She is not afraid of the snow for her household: for all her household are clothed with scarlet. She maketh herself coverings of tapestry; her clothes are silk and purple. Strength and honour are her clothing; and she shall rejoice in time to come. She openeth her mouth with wisdom; and in the tongue is the law of kindness. No lesson in life equals the importance of the lessons that a child receives in regards to prayer; for prayer is the most vital link that any person has when it comes to communicating and gaining a relationship with our Father in Heaven. The simple words repeated by a small child on his knees will train and prepare him for seeking and receiving valuable revelation throughout his life. DOCTRINE AND COVENANTS 68:28 admonishes parents to "teach their child-dren to pray, and to walk uprightly before the lord."


As in all things, a parent's example is the most powerful teaching tool available for lessons on prayer. Witnessing and experiencing prayer through parents is more impressive than might be thought. As mothers and fathers take their turns in family prayer, blessings on the food and other occasions, they need to be careful to avoid vain repetitions. These are readily and easily adopted by young ones. The proper prayer language of thee, thou, thy, thine, etc., should also be used, but big words of flowery vocabulary can make even the mose sincere prayer sail right over the head of a small child. Make vocal prayers, where the family is involved, understandable for everyone. Pray with purpose, feeling, and meaning, so that the spirit will be present. We want the Holy Gost to teach our children also.

Give children opportunities to pray often. Fathers need to be in tune as they call on family members to pray; for a certain one may need to be chosen at a particular time to be the coice of the family in communicating with Heavenly Father. The more times a child prays, the more comfortable he will be with prayer, public and private. Both are important and private time should be given to children for personal prayers daily. Help young ones to establish good habits of prayer early by providing and encouraging opportunities.

Since communication with our Father in Heaven is such a priority in spiritual living, much time should be given to its discussion. We can instill a greater concept of the purpose of prayer by sharing our experiences and feelings about it with our children. Give a family home evening on prayer. Explain how Heavenly Father talks to us and how He has talked to you. And as you have the privilege of personal one on one time with your children, informally bear your testimony as to the power of prayer.

As each one of us learn, struggle, and make efforts in life, we delight in hearing words of praise. Praise reinforces good and so as parents we ought to praise our children freely. Let them know that you are pleased with their thoughtfulness, their courage, their improvement, or whatever is appropriate to them and their prayers. They need this. A parent's approval can make all the difference in the way a child views himself as a child of God.

Now is the time to begin to teach or to continue to teach. Great is the responsibility that the Lord places on parents; but rich are the blessings and joys that come to those who heed His counsel. Eternal families are made up of individuals who love the Lord and who have been fully taught to live as He directs.



PAST MISSIONARY

After the All-Hission Conference on August 22, 1979, my companion and I became really excited about using our time as best we could; and while travelling and looking up referrals, we talked to everyone we could, obtaining a few more referrals in the process. We had an investigator we wanted to visit one night, so at about 1:30 pm we started walking towards his apartment. We came to a place we had passed many times before, but the decision before had never been so hard. My companion knew which way he preferred to go, but he decided not to argue about my decision. I chose the righthand path and we took off.

As we were walking along the sidewalk, about 15 minutes later, Elder Stringer saw a young longhaired high school student approaching. Because of success on referrals already that night, my companion said, "Good evening." How are you?" He gave a non-committal grunt. Thinking he might be interested in our English class, we started talking about it. Then he asked, "Are you guys missionaries?" We said, "Yes," and continued our approach. He asked, "Are you going someplace special?" We explained that we were headed for a friend's place. He seemed a bit disappointed by that, and as we were about to leave, he asked once again where we were going. My companion asked, "Do you have something you want to talk about?" He said, "Is it okay if we talk a little?"

Just before asking, he began to sob softly. Then after his inquiry, he really began to cry. He then confessed that he had just come from the railroad tracks, planning to jump in front of a train. We met him comming away from those tracks, walking to his home some 30 minutes away. Elder Springer immediately grabbed for him, because he had really broken down crying. I put my arms around him and I had my companion and him to sit down on the concrete wall next to the sidewalk. We started telling him

that God lives and loves him and that everything would be okay. Then Elder Springer told him God had planned for us to meet him that night, and again he started crying, just letting out all his frustrations.

We started walking him home, but I suggested, "Let's go to the park." We introduced the plan of salvation and the Joseph Smith story in the park under a street light, but the Spirit was just right. We asked him to pray for help and he said he would. We ended our lesson with prayer. He looked and felt better when we finished.


As we walked him home, he could laugh and enjoy himself again. We met the next night: he had prayed five

up coffee was hard for him. He was baptized two weeks
after we met him, and in one week from his baptism, three
of his friends were baptized also! This was the most
spirit-filled experience of my mission.

He seemed to like it pretty well so we started to teach him the discussions. Wow! what discussions! They were really the most beautiful, spiritual discussions I've seen in my mission. The spirit just beat on my heart and rang through my head that the gospel is true! Many times we finished in tears. and Oscar recieved the discussions with a good spirit. He accepted the baptismal challenge and began to progress towards the set date. He began to read and we could feel and increase of his faith. We got down to the week before his baptism and everything was going well....too well! And, as it always goes, Satan began to work on Oscar, in the form of his other relatives who are not members of the church. They said,..."you don't need to change religions....changing religions is bad." He decided to take their advice, and told us he no longer wanted to be baptized. We almost died! Dear Liahona,

We got your note asking for information about the progress here in the Dominican Republic.

Last year there were over 1300 baptizms in the mission and of course our goal is a little higher. The work is progressing here at a rapid rate. Here in Santiago our first chapel will be finished within a month, and along with that there will be 4 or 5 finished at about the same time in other parts of the country. In addition we have heard rumors that about 15 more are going to be under construction soon and will have a much shorter completion date than the one here.


When these chapels are completed we believe the work will increase at an even greater rate. We believe the presence of a completed chapel will help bring in more and more members.

The Santiago and Santo Domingo Districts have been reorganized, and they are beginning to look more and more like organized stakes. There are many more members now with leadership ability and experience in the church so it will not be very long until we have a couple of stakes here. The mission is changing from door knocking to having cottage meetings in the homes of the members to get new converts as well as to reactivate old ones.

We are one of two couples here in the country now and there is pienty of work for 20 more spanish speaking couples. My wife and I testify that the work here is wonderful and the blessings flow and are truly great. The Lord has blessed us many times in the short time we have been here. We love this work and know that it is inspired, and are grateful for the opportunity we were given to come here and work with these people. We pray that when we retire we will be called again. That is how we feel about our mission.

In an effort to honour our heritage as members of Oklahoma City Fourth Ward, we are going to be publishing articles about various long-time members of the church in this part of the Lord's vineyard. The first articles will honor our past bishops and their wives.

The history of our first bishop is filled with the growth and change of the church in its infant stage in Oklahoma.....

Dean Symons Anderson was born April 17, 1909 of Mormon parents who had "gathered to Zion" from Norway. His father, Christian "Nephi" Anderson will be remembered for the numerous church articles and books which has written. Among the more famous was "Added Upon," which is available in our meetinghouse library and in most LDS outlets.

Having been a very righteous man and a willing servant of the Lord, Brother Anderson's funeral service was conducted by the General Authorities of the church in Utah. His brother, (and Dean's uncle) Carl, having been a noted painter in Norway was chosen to paint the portraits of the prophets for the Coleville Utah tabernacle and later assisted in painting the murals in the Salt Lake City Temple.

Coming from such a righteous and talented family it is no surprise then that Dean also was righteous and talented. He had a beautiful tenor voice and in utilization of that talent, Dean performed with the Salt Lake Metropitan Civic Opera.

During the production of the light opera "The Student Prince" he met and fell in love with Margaret Ada Neal, whom he married April 2, 1938 in the Salt Lake City Temple. Margaret graduated from the University of Utah with a Bachelors Degree in education. She taught school in Salt Lake until her children were born. In October 1946, Dean and Margaret and their little family were transferred from Seattle Washington to Oklahoma by the FAA.

In 1946 the church was meeting in an upper room of the downtown TWCA on Park Avenue and Walker. It was presided over by James A. Cullimore as District President. (Elder Cullimore is now an Emeritus member of the First Quorum of Seventy.)

In 1953 Dean was called as 2nd Counselor to President Cullimore and the following year as 1st counselor of the Western Oklahoma District.

In 1957 he was called to the position of Branch President of the newly organized South Oklahoma City Branch. The saints met in a "little white rented bulding" on South Pennsylvania until our first phase chapel was built.

During construction of our chapel, Dean became ill, and was hospitalized for surgery. As an indication of his committment to the Lord's work....Dean made Margaret drive him to the church to see the work on the chapel before going home from the hospital. The workers were having some problems with the concrete slab. Dean asked Margaret to stay in the car while he went to investigate. His concerned wife said, "You're going to kill yourself." To which he answered: "If I'm going to die, I might as well die doing the work of the Lord." Resigned, she replied "Very well then" and obediently remained in the car.

Dean put himself to work pushing wheelbarrows full of cement with the strength that only comes to the saints of the Lord as they labor in behalf of him.

When asked about their first impressions of Oklahoma, Dean and Margaret said they were shocked at all of the oil wells and felt that as the state had been blessed with an abundance of oil, so had the saints been blessed with an outpouring of the spirit. As always, when hard work is accompanied by mighty prayer, the kingdom grows.

In October 1960 the Western Oklahoma District became the Oklahoma Stake, South Oklahoma City Branch became South Oklahoma City Ward, District President Cullimore became Stake President Cullimore, and President Anderson became our first bishop.

As if their lives as parents and dilegent servants of the kingdom wasn't enough, they both pursued their educations. Dean graduated in June 1952 from OCU college of Law and was admitted into the bar in July 1952 Margaret received her Masters degree in education from OU in 1962. She also taught school for many years planting seeds of the gospel that are still bearing fruit.

Dean was released as bishop in Feb. 1962 and served on the Oklahoma Stake High Council until June of the same year, at which time he was ordained by Gordon B. Hinckley of the Quorum of the Twelve Apostles, as the first Oklahoma Stake Patriarch. During the following 8 years he gave over 800 blessings.

Also during this time their 5 children, Carol, Neal Louise, Marilyn, and Myra Jean completed school and went away to college. Neal served an honorable mission to the Eastern States Mission. All 5 married worthy mates in the temples of the Lord.

Dean and Margaret both retired in 1970. Within a few weeks they had sold their home and said their goodbyes and were winging their way south to the Vera-Cruz Mexico Southeast Mission. They served the saints in Mexico as they had served the saints in Oklahoma, with all their hearts, mights, minds, and strenghts. They preached the gospel and helped teach the members how to can tomatoes.

They were released in Jul 1972 and after a brief trip to Oklahoma, finally found their way back home to Utah were they live today. Most people would have retired to live on their laurels, but not Brother and Sister Anderson. After their release and return from their mission they were called to work in the Sait Lake Temple were they served until December 1981 when they were called to the new Jordan River Temple were they are currently serving.

Dean and Margaret Anderson are living examples that testify of the fulfillment and joy that comes from "eternal service" in the kingdom of the Lord. They have passed their great heritage on to their children and to their 24 grandchildren. (The oldest grandson is now serving in Japan) Their example can also be an example to all of us in the "mission field." Though they were talented and cultured in "Mormonism" they came to this alien land and instead of regretting the lack of things to feed themselves, they followed Christ's example and "fed" others.

Brother Anderson recalls the wonderful people, filied with enthusiasm, determination, hard work, and a willingness to work in the building up the kingdom of God on the earth. It shows in the way the gospel spreads and kingdom grows in Oklahoma. "The riches of oil are as nothing compared to the riches of working with those people." (Dean and Margaret Anderson reside at 860 E Three Fountains Dr. #207, Murray Ut. 84107)

THE AARONIC ORDER ADMINISTERS THE OUTWARD ORDINANCES OF THE GOSPEL, AND IN THE TEMPORAL AFFAIRS OF THE CHURCH, WHEREAS THE MELCHIZEDEK ORDER OFFICIATES IN THE SPIRITUAL ORDINANCES AND THE ADMINISTRATIVE AFFAIRS OF THE CHURCH.
- 2. THE AARONIC AND LEVITICAL ORDERS ARE OFTEN THOUGHT TO BE SYNONYMOUS, BUT THIS IS NOT ENTIRELY ACCURATE. ANCIENTLY THIS PRIESTHOOD WAS RESTRICTED FROM ALL EXCEPT THE DESCENDANTS OF LEVI (WHICH INCLUDED THE THE SON'S OF AARON). THE LEVITICAL ORDER WAS COM-PAREBLE TO THE POSITIONS OF DEACON AND TEACHER IN THE CHURCH TODAY. THE LEVITES ASISSTED THE PRIESTS BUT DID NOT PERFORM ANY ORDINANCES. THE SONS OF AARON HELD THE RIGHT TO PRESIDENCY OVER ALL THE LE-VITES WHO HELD THE PRIESTHOOD. THESE AARONIC PRIESTS OFFICIATED IN THE OUTWARD ORDINANCES AS IS COMMON IN THE CHURCH TODAY.
- 3. THE BISHOP PRESIDES OVER THE AARONIC PRIESTHOOD IN THE WARD. THE PRESIDING BISHOP OF THE CHURCH IS THE PRESIDENT OVER ALL THE AARONIC PRIESTHOOD. ONLY LITERAL DESCENDANTS OF AARON HAVE A LEGAL RIGHT TO THESE OFFICES, OTHERWISE ONLY A HIGH PRIEST OF THE MELCHIZEDEK ORDER MAY OFFICIATE IN HIS STEAD.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

If ever there were doubts about the Church's committment to providing temples for the Latter-day Saints worldwide, events during the last few world conferences quickly dispelled them. Never has there been a time in history which saw more temples announced, started, or completed. And the past April conference was no different.

It began in October 1980 when President Spencer W. Kimball dedicated the first LDS temple in Asia in Tokyo Japan. Three weeks later, the Seattle Temple was dedicated. In February, President Kimball traveled to the South Pacific to break ground for temples in Tahiti, Tonga and Samoa. On March 7, he attended the groundbreaking ceremonies for the Atlanta Temple. The four temples were among seven new temples announced April 2, 1980- the most temples ever announced at one time....the most, that is, until April 1 1981, when the First Presidency announced plans to build nine new temples in Chicago, Ill.; Dallas, Texas; Guatemala City, Guatemala; Lima, Peru; Frankfurt, West Germany; Stockholm Sweeden; Seoul, Korea; Manila, Philippines; and Johannesburg, South Africa.

This past April the First Presidency announced the building of four new temples on three continents. Guayaquil, Ecuador; Denver, Colorado; Taipei, Taiwan; and Boise, Idaho, bringing the world wide total to 20 temples operating world wide, with 21 under construction or in the planning stages.

Other importaint changes were the shortening of the lengths of the full time missions from two years to one year and a half, and changes in the financial policies of the constuction church buildings.



THE LAW OF IDLENESS

THIS LAW GOVERNS PHYSICAL, MENTAL, SPIRITUAL, SOCIAL AND PERSONALITY DEVELOPMENT. IT SAYS THAT THE WAY TO GROWTH IS ACTIVITY, WHEREAS THE WAY TO DEATH IS IDLENESS. RUNNING WATER PURIFIES ITSELF, BUT THE STAGNANT WATER OF AN INACTIVE POND BECOMES IMPURE AND UNHEALTHY, AS SO DO THE CELLS OF A SLUGGISH BODY OR AN INACTIVE BRAIN. LAZINESS IS THE INFLUENCE OF AN INACTIVE MIND UPON THE CELLS

OF THE BODY.

NOTHING IS MORE COMMON THAN MENTAL INERTIA. FOR EVERY TEN PEOPLE WHO ARE PHYSICALLY LAZY THERE ARE TEN THOUSAND WITH STAGNANT MINDS, AND STAGNANT MINDS ARE BREEDING PLACES OF FEAR, IGNORANCE, SIN AND CRIME. THE PERSON WHO IS ACTIVE GENERATES POWER AND BREEDS COURAGE. THE ONE WHO HAS POWER IN HIS RIGHTEOUSNESS HAS LITTLE TO FEAR, WHILE THE UNPROFITABLE SERVANT ALLOWS HIS FEAR TO DESTROY HIS FAITH. WE CAN BUILD UP OUR FAITH AND OUR INDUSTRY TO WHERE IT WILL ELIMINATE OUR FEAR.

ONE OF NATURE'S LAWS TELLS US THAT WE SHOULD EARN OUR BREAD BEFORE WE EAT IT. WHEN YOUNG PEOPLE WANT TOO MUCH EASE AT THE BEGINNING OF THEIR LIVES, THEY ARE USUALLY DOOMED TO FAILURE. REST COMES ONLY AFTER IT HAS BEEN EARNED. WHEN NATURE SEES A YOUNG PERSON ENGAGED IN IN-ACTIVITY, SHE ASSUMES THAT HE WISHES TO BECOME A NOBODY AND IMMEDIATELY BEGINS GRANTING HIS REQUEST.

Many otherwise capable people succumb to this negative Law. Often the sons of wealthy families are not properly impressed with the necessity for effort. They try to slide from first base to home plate on their family name and, in conformity with this law of ease, they lose their inheritance. When one sits too long on his cushions of advantage, he goes to sleep and is soon eliminated from the race.

THERE ARE OTHERS WHO FAIL BECAUSE THEIR FIRST EFFORTS MISCARRY, AND THEY LOSE HEART AND QUIT. SUCCESS LIKES TO BE SOUGHT AFTER AND WOOED. THE MASTER HIMSELF SAID, "Pray without ceasing." LIFE DOES NOT ALWAYS GRANT ONE'S

FIRST PETITION. UBSTACLES ARE PUT IN OUR WAY TO STRENG-THEN US, BUT WHEN WE MISUNDERSTAND THEIR PURPOSE AND AL-LOW THEM TO BREED DISCOURAGEMENT — THAT IS, WHEN WE CAN-NOT TELL THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN TEMPORARY SETBACKS AND PERMANENT FAILURE — THEN WE TURN OFF OUR EFFORT AND SUC-CUMB TO THE PENALTIES OF THE LAW OF IDLENESS.

TEMPORARY FAILURE IS NATURE'S GREAT CRUCIBLE IN WHICH SHE BURNS THE DROSS FROM THE HUMAN HEART AND SO PURIFIES THE MAN THAT HE CAN STAND HARDER USAGE. IT IS SAID THAT FORTUNE OFTEN DISAPPOINTS HIM WHOM SHE SECRETLY ANOINTS. A POET HAS WRITTEN:

HOW SHE HAMMERS HIM AND HURTS HIM-AND WITH MIGHTY BLOWS CONVERTS HIM-

HARD HAMMERING IS ALWAYS NECESSARY TO MAKE THE FINEST STEEL. BECAUSE OF THE LAW OF OPPOSITION, IT IS NECESSARY THAT PEOPLE BE ACQUAINTED WITH OBSTACLES AND ROUGH GOING. MOST MEN DEVELOP FASTER AFTER THEY UNDERSTAND OPPOSITION, WHICH AROUSES THEM TO GREATER ACTION. OUR STRENGTH GROWS OUT OF OUR WEAKNESS. NOT UNTIL WE ARE PRICKED AND STUNNED AND SHOT AT IS OUR INDIGNATION AWAKENED. WHEN HE IS PUNISHED, TORMENTED, AND DEFEATED, A PERSON HAS A CHANCE TO LEARN SOMETHING. AND WHEN WE CEASE TO LOOK FOR A LIFE OF EASE, WE HAVE A CHANCE TO GO PLACES.

NATURALLY, WE WOULD ALL LIKE TO HAVE SOMEONE GIVE US DETAILED DIRECTIONS AS TO HOW TO SUCCEED AND THEN GIVE US THE PUSH THAT WOULD CARRY US ACROSS THE GOAL LINE. NO ONE CAN SUCCEED FOR US EXCEPT OURSELVES, AND NO TWO PERSONS FIND THE SAME WAY TO THE GOAL. EACH MUST FIND HIS WAY THERE BY HIMSELF. EFFORT AND STRUGGLE -- BOTH MENTAL AND PHYSICAL -- ARE THE WAY BY WHICH WE ACHIEVE. LIFE WAS NEVER INTENDED TO BE JUST A PLEASURE TRIP OR A DOWNHILL RIDE. IT IS AN UPHILL JOURNEY. IT IS A CONQUEST, A LONG SERIES OF DIFFICULTIES AND OBSTACLES TO BE MASTERED.

DON'T WORRY ABOUT GETTING TIRED, FOR WEARINESS USUALLY DOES NOT COME FROM OVERWORK, BUT FROM LACK OF INTEREST IN WHAT YOU ARE DOING. THE MUSCLES NEVER GROW FAST UNTIL WE GIVE THEM SOME HEAVY USAGE. THE POSSESSION OF POTENTIAL POWER AND THE USE OF IT ARE TWO DIFFERENT THINGS. THE USE OF OUR STRENGTH MAKES US POWERFUL, WHILE THE PUR-

The following article came into my possession about 1969 - 1970 from a non-Mormon source. Non-members may be astounded, and latter-Day Saints-peacefully assured.




AN AMAZING STORY




Anguish-filled hours dragged slowly by as he hung trembling because of pain and suffering both body and spirit till the Father in perfect love and understanding withdrew.
