

PEOPLE YOU SHOULD KNOW



drove all over town to find her living about five blocks from our apartment. When we arrived at her house it was 9 o'clock. Since she lived so close we thought it might be smarter to come back another time, but we both thought we should at least introduce ourselves.

After knocking on the door, a short gray haired woman escorted us into her small one-room house. She was excited to see us. and asked why the missionaries stopped coming by to visit her. We explained that we were new to the area, but wanted to continue where the others have left off. We asked if she had any questions for us, she responded "yes, tell me the part about how families can be together forever again." We taught her the plan of salvation and explained the role of Temples in eternal families. "Temples are beautiful aren't they" she said, and continued.. "The other night I dreamt of a huge gray temple. It had a big grassy lawn in front and people were going inside. I think it had lots of windows with pictures of the sun and stars above them. Inside I remember a beautiful gold stairway with people all dressed in white. Jesus came and appeared there."

Most Patient: Jennifer - She never complains when it takes me forever to gather things up before taking her home.


Best Dressed: Erin - She wears the wildest colored pajama/sweat outfits.
